As you will no longer be a HIP Intern for the above identified HIP project, your access to national security information, classified or unclassified sensitive, is terminated.

Before you were given access to classified materials, you signed the Classified Information Nondisclosure Agreement (SF312) with the government agreeing to safeguard all classified information to which you have/had access. **This signed agreement is a lifelong responsibility.**

Should you, at any time (this could be years from now), believe someone is attempting to learn about the classified and/or sensitive unclassified material you handled as a HIP Intern at your DoD Host Institution, please contact your Host Institution, the HPCMPO, or your local FBI office.

(NOTE: The following paragraph is intended for personnel who had **access to secure areas, classified computer and classified documents.** The question relates to US Code 18, Espionage.)

All classified and sensitive unclassified material is Government-owned and cannot be removed. Have you returned all classified and sensitive unclassified material you had in your possession whether at HPCMP or any other site? This includes your Internship Journal.

Your responsibility to safeguard classified information comes under Chapter 37, Section 1386 Title 18, U.S. Code, Espionage and Censorship. Do you have any questions about your future responsibilities to continue to safeguard national security information? If you wish to review the Code, or have questions such as "What material (research paper, slides, poster, code) can you use or share when you return to school?", you can contact your Host Institution's security officer.

I have returned any/all classified and sensitive unclassified materials (such as lab notebooks) and I recognize my continuing responsibility to safeguard national security information.
